God's Amazing Actions Towards Our Sin

1. He forgives our transgression (Ps. 32:1, 5).

Blessed is the one whose transgression **is forgiven**, whose sin is covered. ² Blessed is the man against whom the LORD counts no iniquity, and in whose spirit there is no deceit.

2. He covers our sin (Ps. 32:1; Rom. 4:7).

Blessed is the one whose transgression is forgiven, whose sin is covered

Romans 4:6-8 – "just as David also speaks of the blessing of the one to whom God counts righteousness apart from works: 7 "Blessed are those whose lawless deeds are forgiven, and whose sins are covered; 8 blessed is the man against whom the Lord will not count his sin."

3. He does not charge us with iniquity (Ps. 32:2; Rom. 4:8).

"Blessed is the man against whom the LORD counts no iniquity..."

4. He removes our sins from us (Ps. 103:12; John 1:29).

Psalm 103:12 "as far as the east is from the west, so far does he remove our transgressions from us.

5. He throws all our sins behind His back (Isa. 38:17).

....but in love you have delivered my life from the pit of destruction, for <u>you have cast all my sins behind your back."</u>

6. He sweeps away our transgressions (Isa 44:22; Psalm 51:1).

I have blotted out your transgressions like a cloud and your sins like mist; return to me, for I have redeemed you.

7. He remembers our sins no more (Isa. 43:25; Jer. 31:34; Heb. 8:12; 10:16-17).

"I, I am he who <u>blots out your transgressions</u> for my own sake, <u>and I will not remember your sins</u>. Hebrews 8:12 - For I will be merciful toward their iniquities, and I will remember their sins no more."

8. He casts all our sins into the depths of the sea (Mic. 7:18-19).

Who is a God like you, pardoning iniquity and passing over transgression for the remnant of his inheritance? He does not retain his anger forever, because he delights in steadfast love. ¹⁹ He will again have compassion on us; he will tread our iniquities underfoot. You will <u>cast all our sins into the depths of the sea</u>.

9. He washes away our guilt and cleanses us from our sin (Ps. 51:2; Isa. 1:18; 1 John 1:9).

Ps. 51:2 - Wash me thoroughly from my iniquity, and cleanse me from my sin!

10. He nailed our sin debt to the cross (Col. 2:13, 14).

And you, who were dead in your trespasses and the uncircumcision of your flesh, God made alive together with him, having forgiven us all our trespasses, ¹⁴ by <u>canceling the record of debt that stood against us with its legal demands</u>. This he set aside, <u>nailing it to the cross</u>.
